## Basic Supply Kit

**Water** (1 gallon per person per day for at least 3 days), **Food** (at least a 3-day supply of non-perishables, per person), **Emergency Light Sources** (flashlights, candles, lanterns), **Portable Radio, Extra Batteries, First Aid Kit, Medications, Infant/Pet Supplies, Important Family Documents** (in waterproof container), **Blanket** (for each person)

## Additional Supplies

**Glasses/Contacts** (contact solution), **Cash/Traveler's Checks, Can Opener, Backup Cell Phone Battery/Charger, Sleeping Bag, Changes of Clothes, Wrench or Pliers** (to turn off utilities), **Bleach, Fire extinguisher, Matches, Whistle** (to signal for help), **Feminine Supplies, Personal Hygiene Items, Dust Mask, Plastic Sheeting, Duct Tape, Area Maps, Mess Kits** (cups, plates, paper towels, and plastic utensils), **Paper and Pencil, Books, Games, Puzzles, Activities for Children**

## Add these items for Hurricane Season 2020 to avoid the spread of the COVID-19 virus

**Face coverings/masks, Hand sanitizer, Sanitizing wipes**

## Supply Kit for Pets

**Food and Water** (at least a 3-day supply, per pet), **Medication and Medical Records, Important Documents** (adoption papers, vaccination), **First Aid Kit, Collar or Harness** (with up-to-date ID tag and rabies info), **Leash, Sanitation Items, Picture of your pet, Carriers, Toys and Treats**

Make sure all your pets are wearing collars and tags with up-to-date identification & contact information. If not already, consider getting them microchipped.

## Supply Kit for the Car

**Jumper Cables, Flares or Reflective Triangle, Car Cell Phone Chargers, Blanket, Map, Cat Litter or Sand** (to get tire traction)

Prepare your car, prior to an emergency, check: **Antifreeze Levels, Battery and Ignition System, Brakes, Exhaust System, Fuel and Air Filters, Heater and Defroster, All Lights, Oil, Windshield Wipers and Fluid, Tires**

Keep your gas tank full in the event of an evacuation or power outage

## Maintaining your Kit

Keep canned food in a cool, dry place, store boxed food in tightly closed plastic containers, replace expired items and re-think your kits, as needed

**Keep Emergency Kits at: home, work, and your vehicle**
