Arrests:

Wanted Person: On October 23, 2020 Kill Devil Hills police responded to the Days Inn Mariner for a disturbance. The female on scene was taken into custody for warrants out of Catawba and Gaston Counties. She was also charged with numerous narcotics violations. Dare County Department of Social Services arrived on scene and took the minor into custody until additional family could arrive.

Intoxicated and Disruptive: On October 15, 2020 Kill Devil Hills Police were dispatched to drunk disturbance call in the area of the 1600 block of South Croatan Hwy. Upon investigation a male was arrested for intoxicated and disruptive.

Suspicious Person: On October 11, 2020 officers were dispatched to a suspicious condition at Walgreens for a women passed out behind the wheel in the parking lot. Upon arrival officers witnessed a female in the vehicle with her 15 week old son. The female consented to a search of her vehicle and meth was found. EMS arrived on scene and she was transported to OBH. An officer obtained warrants on the female for possession of schedule I, possession drug paraphilia, and misdemeanor child abuse. DSS was notified and took temporary custody of the child.

BIKE AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY



On October 6 and October 13, 2020, officers from Kill Devil Hills, Nags Head and Manteo police departments participated in a joint community event with the Outer Banks Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Coalition to raise awareness about Pedestrian Safety Month. The event was a collaboration with the statewide Watch for Me NC campaign. Watch For Me NC is a program aimed at reducing the number of pedestrian and bicycle crashes with motorists.

Local officers set up booths at First Flight Elementary School and Manteo Elementary School and passed out information related to Pedestrian Safety Month. Part of the handout included bags with various safety items including slap bracelets, bike lights and glow sticks. Over 400 brochures and bags were handed out to the public over the two days.
