**Beach Driving Permit Information**  
**October 1, 2025 – April 30, 2026 Driving Season**

To apply for a beach driving permit in the Town of Kill Devil Hills, you must complete an application at one of the two locations listed below or online at [kdhnc.com](http://kdhnc.com):

**KDH beach driving permits are only for driving on Kill Devil Hills beaches.**

**KDH Finance Department:** Cashier’s Counter, located on the second floor of Town Hall, 102 Town Hall Drive, Kill Devil Hills, NC. Hours: 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., Monday – Friday

**Payment method:** cash, check, credit or debit card

Information you will need:

- Vehicle license plate number
- Vehicle identification number (VIN) – located on vehicle, registration card or insurance certificate

The applicant will receive a copy of the Kill Devil Hills Beach Driving Access Maps and Regulations.

**REMEMBER:**

**The speed limit for beach driving is 15 mph.**


**Driving is permitted daily from ½ hour before sunrise to ½ hour following sunset.**

**Modified Utility Vehicles (MUTVs) are not permitted on Kill Devil Hills beaches.**

# Town of Kill Devil Hills: Tips for Safe Beach Driving

## Drive Safely

- The speed limit is **15 miles per hour** or as posted.
- Before driving onto the beach, check to verify that the access onto the beach is clear of pedestrians, vehicles, or other obstacles.
- Use **extreme caution** when driving on the beach accesses, there may be blind spots when crossing to get to the beach.
- Beach pedestrians always have the right-of-way. Reduce your speed within 100 feet of any person lying, standing, or walking on the beach. Drive slowly and detour around them. **Stay alert for children and pets!**
- Watch for fishing lines.
- Open alcoholic beverage containers are illegal in moving vehicles. Never drink and drive.
- Glass containers of any sort **cannot** be transported onto the beach and are **not allowed** on the beach.
- **REMEMBER**: beach driving is permitted daily from 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes following sunset.
- **KDH Beach Driving Permits are only for driving on Kill Devil Hills beaches.**

## Avoid Damaging Vegetation

- Drive only on the ocean side of the dune line.
- Do not drive on or across the dunes, except on marked routes.
- The map in the Beach Driving packet shows the location of the exits to and from the beach.

## Protect the Beach and Its Wildlife

- Be alert for and obey signs which indicate closed areas for turtle nests and other protected and non-protected wildlife.

## Preparations

- The weather can change quickly here. Check the weather forecasts and tide tables before starting your trip.
- Some sections of the beach may be impassable at high tide and during bad weather.
- Ask KDH Ocean Rescue Division – 252-480-0080 about current beach conditions.
- The beach is constantly changing and may be totally different from the last time you drove on it. Ruts and berms can form with the changing tides.
- Know your surroundings at all times in case you need to call for assistance and direct help to your location as quickly as possible.

## Tire pressure

- Lower the pressure in all tires to a recommended 20-25 pounds before you drive onto the sand. Follow the manufacturer's recommendations for your vehicle.
- The softer the sand, the lower the pressure needed for better traction.
- Once you depart from the beach, inflate your tires to normal pressure as soon as possible.
- On paved roads, low tire pressure can affect vehicle braking and maneuverability.



## Town of Kill Devil Hills: Tips for Safe Beach Driving

### Carry an off-road kit containing the following equipment

- tire pressure gauge
- first aid kit
- shovel
- spare tire
- air pump
- tow rope (at least 14 feet long with load strength of 20,000 pounds.)
- litter bag
- flashlight/batteries
- bumper jack with base support board
- extra boards (for traction)
- water (since vehicles can quickly overheat on the sand)
- extra phone charger
- fire extinguisher

### Also

- Keep your cell phone protected from the environment.
- Know the times for sunrise and sunset the day you plan to drive on the beach.
- If you need help, but it is not a life threatening emergency, call 252-473-3444 for assistance. (Example: your vehicle becomes stuck too close to the ocean water on a rising tide.)
- For the protection of your vehicle – rinse it off after you leave the beach.

# TOWN OF KILL DEVIL HILLS

## Regulations Governing Off-Road Vehicles

### § 96.10. Driving on sand dunes.

No persons shall drive any type of vehicle, including but not limited to bicycles, automobiles, motorcycles, dirt-bikes, ATVs and beach buggies on sand dunes within the town, provided that this prohibition shall not include police and other emergency vehicles.

### § 96.20. Generally.

(A) No person shall operate any vehicle of any type, such as a beach buggy, jeep, motorcycle, bicycle, dirt-bike, any one-, two-, three-, four- or more wheeled vehicle powered by any type of motor or physically propelled on the ocean beach area from May 1 through September 30.

(B) This section shall not prohibit the use of specified vehicles from that area seaward of and including the frontal dune system by commercial anglers engaged in commercial fishing activities.

### § 96.21. Permits.

(A) *Eligible vehicles.* Permits shall be issued only for properly registered and licensed vehicles having a four-wheel drive or an all-wheel drive and which shall have passed inspection by the department of motor vehicles of the state or by the equivalent department or agency of the state in which such vehicle is licensed, if applicable. Any boat transported onto the beach must be properly registered and marked according to the licensing jurisdiction. Modified utility vehicles ("MUTV") as described in N.C.G.S. 20-4.01(27) shall not be considered an "eligible" vehicle regardless of whether the MUTV is registered or licensed in any state.

(B) *Applications; period of validity.*

(1) Any person desiring to operate a permitted vehicle on the beach of the town shall make application to the appropriately designated employee of the Town of Kill Devil Hills. A permit issued hereunder shall be valid from 12:01 a.m. October 1 and shall expire at 11:59 p.m. on April 30 of the following year.

(2) It is further provided that there shall be a separate permit for each vehicle for which a permit is desired under the terms of this division; except for holders of a valid state commercial fishing license, operating one or more vehicles in the business of commercial fishing, upon inspection of all vehicles so used when owned and titled in the same name and upon payment of the fee for the issuance of a single permit, duplicate permits shall be issued for all vehicles so used and owned as hereinabove stated; provided, that all such vehicles meet the licensing, inspection and financial requirements as set out in subsection (A) of this section.

(3) Short-term permits up to 14 days duration may be issued.

(C) *Fee.* An applicant for a permit will pay a non-refundable fee in accordance with the regularly adopted fee schedule of the town at the time of issuance of the permit and will receive a device or insignia which must be permanently affixed and displayed on the left front bumper of the vehicle; except, however, in the case of a short-term/up to 14 days duration permit, a paper permit may substitute for a device or insignia which must be visibly placed on the dashboard when the vehicle is being operated on the beach.

(D) *Issuance not deemed authority to operate on private property.* No permit issued under this section shall be construed to authorize a vehicle or the owner or operator thereof to operate on private property without the permission of the owner of such property.

### § 96.22. Rules of operation; operation on beaches.

Vehicles operated on the ocean beach in Kill Devil Hills shall be operated in accordance with the following rules:

(A) Permitted vehicles going to and from the beach area shall use as an entrance and exit only the designated vehicular beach access points which shall be designated as such by the Town Manager of the town and appropriately marked. No vehicle shall at any time cross to the beach unless crossing at designated accesses.

(B) No vehicle shall be operated on the beach at a speed in excess of fifteen miles per hour.

(C) No vehicle shall be operated west of the "toe of slope" of the dune except in going to and from the beach area at authorized vehicular beach access points. However, nothing contained in this section shall be construed to permit driving on the barrier dunes or driving on private property without the express permission of the owner, even though the "toe of slope" may be located west of the private property east boundary, which extends to the mean high water mark of the ocean.

(D) No vehicle shall be operated between the waterline and the high tide mark (commonly referred to as the "wet sand" area).

(E) Vehicles having permits may be operated on the beach only from one-half hour prior to sunrise to one-half hour following sunset daily.

(F) Pedestrians, including swimmers, bathers, and sunbathers shall have the right-of-way over all vehicles being operated on the beach.

(G) The ordinances adopted herein and the provisions of Chapter 20 of the North Carolina General Statutes (NCGS) shall be enforced on the ocean beaches within the boundaries of Kill Devil Hills as provided by NCGS 160A-205, NCGS 160A-175, and NCGS Chapter 20.

(H) Any operator of any vehicle on the beach area or going to and from the beach must have a current and valid motor vehicle operator's license issued by their state of residence and be operating an eligible vehicle as defined in §96.21(A).

**§ 96.23 Beach Driving Privileges for Disabled Individuals.**

The Police Chief or designee may issue permits allowing for the use of an all-terrain vehicle on areas covered by this section when such use constitutes a reasonable accommodation under the Americans with Disabilities Act as Amended to enable a disabled person to operate a vehicle as otherwise authorized under this Chapter. Permits may be obtained at either the Town of Kill Devil Hills Police Department during normal office hours.

(A) The application for a permit shall be accompanied by a certification from a licensed physician that the applicant has a disability that prevents them from obtaining a permit to operate a vehicle as defined in this Chapter on the ocean beach.

(B) Beach driving for all persons is permitted only from October 1 through April 30, annually.

(C) Upon receiving an application for a beach driving permit that meets the requirement of this ordinance, the Police Department may issue a beach driving permit which shall be limited to one beach driving season. Applicants may seek a permit for each beach driving season.

**§ 96.24. Exceptions.**

(A) Agencies of the United States government, law enforcement agencies, fire departments, ocean rescue services, wildlife protection and/or conservation organizations, emergency medical services, and employees, agents, contractors and subcontractors for the Town of Kill Devil Hills, including those conducting beach restoration or protection work, engaged in their official duties are exempt from the provisions of this chapter. The police chief or his designee may, from time to time, allow such other services and/or governmental agencies to utilize town beaches with such conditions as may be established on a case by case basis provided that such utilization is for the public benefit.

(B) The date and time limitation provided in section § 96.21 shall not apply to commercial anglers holding a valid state commercial fishing license when engaged in commercial fishing activities.

**§ 96.25. Closure.**

The Town Manager shall have the authority to close any vehicular beach access points, portion of the beach or all of the beach at such times and places that extensive beach erosion occurs. This authority may be exercised by the town manager when, as a result of inspections by the Town Manager or the town employees subject to the Town Manager's authority, it is determined that the width of the beach between the toe of the slope of the dune and the area affected by ocean wash and waves is such that driving would either be dangerous or increase the effects of erosion, or the beach is not sufficiently wide or stable to support vehicular traffic.

**§ 96.26. Violations, revocation of permit.**

(A) Violations of town ordinances shall subject the offender to a criminal misdemeanor under NCGS 14-4. Violations of Chapter 20 of the North Carolina General Statutes shall be punished as provided by the North Carolina General Statutes.

(B) Violations of this article involving threatened or endangered species shall subject the offender to civil and criminal penalties imposed by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. The town will forward all enforcement actions to the United States Fish and Wildlife Service for maximum enforcement action.

(C) The police chief or designee shall have the authority to revoke a permit issued under this article for one (1) or more violations of this article. The police chief or his designee shall consider the number, nature, and intent associated with the violation(s) in making a determination to revoke a permit, and shall also determine the timeframe said permit is revoked.

**The maximum speed for beach driving in Kill Devil Hills is 15 mph.**
